2. The Pledge of Allegiance

Supervisor Deer, called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Councilor Italiano led the Pledge of Allegiance. Supervisor Deer welcomed everyone and thanked all for attending.

3. 6:30 PM Open Podium

Ruth Anne Winschel, Manlius, presented information to the Town Board on the ways that the Town could support autistic people through education and training of employees.

Scarlett Davidson, Kirkville, stated that the smaller trash cans will not be functional for her and asked if there was anything the Town Board could do.

4. 6:45 PM Public Hearing – Local Law 2022-5 Video Conferencing

This law created a chapter in the Town Code that authorized the members of public bodies in the Town to participate in and vote in meetings via video conference. Members may video conference from locations that not accessible to the public so long as a quorum of the public body participates from locations where the public may be physically present and other conditions are met. The conditions are outlined in the “Town of Manlius Videoconferencing Policy and Guidelines”.

Councilor Waters made a motion, seconded by Councilor Italiano, to waive the reading of the public notice in the matter of the proposed local law 2022-5 Creating Chapter 29 Entitled “Town Board Polices” for Video Conferencing of Meetings.
